

# ALS College Scholarships

## [Hope Loves Company Susan B. Anderson Scholarship](#)

**Amount:** Not specified

**Information:** Applicants must be an HLC Young Ambassador recently graduated from high school and attending an accredited 2 or 4 year college.

## [Live Like Lou Iron Horse Scholarship](#)

**Amount:** Up to \$2130 per semester, for up to 4 years

**Information:** Open to “dependents of ALS patients within five years of his or her life” and attending a post secondary educational institution. Subject to fund availability.

## [The Jane Calmes ALS Scholarship Fund \(ALSA\)](#)

**Amount:** \$5000 (payment split over 2 semesters)

**Information:** Open to high school seniors and undergraduates whose finances have been impacted by an ALS diagnosis planning to enroll in 6+ credit hours at a 2 or 4 year college, university, or vocational school.

## [The PHAALS Foundation Hall of Fame Legend Scholarship](#)

**Amount:** \$2500

**Information:** Open to applicants with a parent or grandparent who has been inducted into the PHAALS Foundation Hall of Fame program and are pursuing post-high school education.

## [The Douglas MacInnes ALS Scholarship](#)

**Amount:** Starts at \$500

**Information:** Open to those who have been “influenced by ALS and are planning to pursue higher education”.

## [Merfeld Family Foundation Scholarship Fund](#)

**Amount:** \$2500

**Information:** Open to graduating seniors planning to enroll or currently attending a full-time at a 4-year “Candidates must be from a family where a parent was diagnosed with ALS while the applicant was/is in high school or in college”.

## [ALS Ride for Life Scholarship](#) *(New York state residents only)*

**Amount:** Varies

**Information:** Open to high school seniors with a “direct and verifiable family connection to ALS.” Applicants must be accepted, or anticipate acceptance, to an accredited college.

## [ALS Family Charitable Foundation Inc. Scholarship](#) *(New England residents only)*

**Amount:** \$1500

**Information:** Open to recent high school graduates who are the “child of an ALS Family Charitable Foundation patient.” Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and be enrolled in at least 9 credit hours.

## [The Paula Kovarick Segalman Family Scholarship Fund for ALS](#) *(Maryland, Virginia and D.C. residents only)*

**Amount:** \$10,000 to one individual per year

**Information:** Open to those with a parent or legal guardian diagnosed with ALS. Applicants must attend or be accepted to a 2 or 4 year college, university or not-for-profit vocational school and have a household income of less than \$50,000 annually.
